GOALS:

Currently:

- 9.4% lives in 75041
- Roughly 20% engages in classes, groups, and ministry service.

Imagine: We are faced with deciding whether to have multiple class times or add on to our building because we are out of space for classes.

Imagine: We are excited to invite coworkers to our connect groups because that is the first thing we think of when we want to get to know someone.

Imagine: We have to mount cameras above the baptistry because of the crowds flocking to the stage to witness up-close our regular and frequent baptisms.

Imagine: We must decide what to do with the budget surplus because people are so excited to give toward what they see God doing in our church.

Imagine: We don't even know all the ministries of SR, because people are so excited they're starting them in their homes instead of waiting on the institution of church to start them.

- report to, and are part of larger Shepherding Elders group














Barnabas Ex-Elders

Ministry Leader


(task-focused)

Some groups meet weekly. Some groups meet twice a month. Some groups meet for six weeks and some meet for decades.






